“DEAD MAN DOWN”: MADE IN PHILADELPHIA. “SS UNITED STATES: MADE IN AMERICA.”

The SS Unites States is a luxury passenger liner built in 1952 for the United States Lines designed to capture the Trans-Atlantic speed record.

The SS United States was the fastest ocean liner to cross the Atlantic in either direction. Even in retirement, the SS United States retains the Blue Riband given to the passenger liner crossing the Atlantic Ocean in regular service with the record highest speed.

The SS United States operated uninterrupted in Trans-Atlantic passenger service until 1969.

The SS United States has been docked at Pier 82 since 1996 and served as host for an upcoming romantic thriller motion picture. Portions of the feature motion picture will be filmed on board the SS United States.

SS United States docked at Pier 82 in Philadelphia

On April 23, 2012 in Philadelphia, principal photography began aboard the SS United States for “Dead Man Down”, a major motion picture from IM Global. The film stars Colin Farrell, Noomi Rapace, Terrence Howard and Dominic Cooper. The Philadelphia shoot will continue into June.

The director of the film is Niels Arden Oplev, who directed the original 2009 Swedish language version of “The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo”, which starred Ms. Rapace as Lisbeth Salander. Niels Sejer is Production De-

signer for the film.

The SS United States Conservancy served as host to the film company and crew on its first day of shooting. A press conference was held to celebrate the event with the ship serving as a fitting backdrop. HEAT STRESS TIPS

Working in a hot environment can cause heat to build up in the body. Heat stress occurs when the body's cooling system cannot get rid of the heat fast enough. Heat stress can lead to heat exhaustion, which is serious, or heat stroke, which can kill you.

Recognize Common Symptoms of Heat Stress:

- Headache
- Dizziness
- Weakness and wet skin
- Irritability or confusion
- Thirst, nausea, or vomiting
- Increased heart rate
- Cramps or chills
- Red, hot, dry skin
- High Temperature
- Confusion or inability to think clearly
- Fainting
- Convulsions

What to Do if Someone is Suffering from Heat Stress:

- Get help immediately
- Notify your Supervisor or call 911
- Move the victim to a cool area
- Offer sips of water if conscious
- Remove or loosen excess clothing
- Fan and spray victim with cool water. Put ice packs on the person's groin and underarms or soak the person's clothing with cool water.

Protecting Yourself Against Heat Stress:

- Keep watch on each other
- Dress appropriately—Wear light colored clothing
- Drink water often
- Rest in the shade
- Report heat symptoms early
- Know what to do in an emergency
